CUNY-BC in China Program

Winter 2020 (Tentative dates: Dec 29 - Jan 22)

Application Deadline: Oct 28, 2019

Total estimated program cost: only \$3,450, which includes

- 1. round trip international airfare (New York to Beijing; Shanghai to New York)
- 2. hotel rooms in all the cities in China (double occupancy, single room for extra \$750)
- 3. transportation within and between the cities in China
- 4. admission tickets to scenic spots in 5 famous Chinese cities (Travel and sightseeing in China are arranged by professional travel agencies)
- 5. meals (see the notes at the program website)
- 6. Int'l travel insurance

Cost not included:

- 1. Visa fee: \$140 for U.S. passports; \$30 for others
- 2. CUNY tuition
- 3. Personal expenses & side trips

Payment Due Dates:

- --No personal checks will be accepted.
- --Payments must be in money order or bank cashier's check payable to "Brooklyn College."
- 1. \$450, due with application before/on Oct 28, 2019
 - a. Non-refundable if you are accepted into the program
 - b. A \$30 late fee applies to applications received after the (extended) deadline
- 2. \$1,500, second payment due Oct 31, 2019
 - a. Payment after the due date may mean an additional charge for international airline tickets
 - b. Airline tickets purchased are not refundable or transferable
 - c. There is a fee of \$30 per week for late payment
- 3. \$1,500, final payment due Nov 19, 2019
 - a. Half of the final payment is refundable for cancellations made, in writing, before Nov 26, 2019
 - b. None is refundable if the participant cancels the trip, in writing, on/after Nov 26, 2019
 - c. There is a fee of \$50 per week for late payment

Notes:

- 1. No personal checks are accepted. All payments must be in money order or bank cashier's checks payable to "Brooklyn College."
- 2. Payments by credit card are acceptable, subject to a 2.65% non-refundable convenience fee.
- 3. All bounced payments will be subject to a fee of \$30.00; Late fees will apply to actual payment made after the deadline.
- 4. If the exchange rates between US and Chinese currencies change by more than 2%, or, if the airline ticket fare and other services in China cost more than the estimated, the trip organizer reserves the right to adjust the trip cost accordingly.
